Monotheism and Polytheism

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Foreword

Israeli occupation of Palestine is the cause of one of the greatest human misery today. The daily humiliation of Palestinian people by the Israeli is the cause of Palestinian terrorism. The Israeli rarely admit it, but it was the Jewish terrorism against British Empire that made the Great Britain give up rule of Palestine. Then Israel was erected in 1948 based on the "Division of Palestine Plan" approved by the United Nations. The remaining is the state terrorism by Israel on the residents of Palestine, beginning with immediate expulsion of 750 thousand Palestinians from their home lands, occupation of the whole Palestine in 1967, continuous expansion of illegal Jewish settlements in the occupied land, daily harassment of the Palestinians by Israeli police and military and frequent violence by the settlers and complete blockade of Gaza for nearly 20 years. Hamas terrorism on 7, October, 1923 was a trigger of the ongoing terrible bombardments and genocide of more than 41,000 people in Gaza, but not cause of the conflicts. The true cause is the humiliation of the Palestinian people by the state of Israel. Palestinians are human beings. They do want independence, justice, protection of their fundamental human rights. The oppressed have the right to resist the oppressors.

Watching terrible genocide in Gaza on TV, I wonder what makes Israel such an inhuman terrorist state. The following is my study about the question.

Monotheism

Judaism and Islam are monotheism. They have common religious root.

In Judaism and Islam worship of idols is a serious sin because monotheism God does not allow existence of any other deity and is absolute, hence cannot be expressed in pictures or sculptures.

Christianity

Contrary to general understanding, I believe Christianity is not essentially related with Judaism. The trinity theory itself reveals that Christianity is not monotheism. Polytheism

In my knowledge, all other religions in the world are Polytheism.

- Ancient Greek and Rome

The mythologies of ancient Greek and Rome are typical polytheism. Numerous gods mutually interact and with the people. They even breed with the people to bear heroes and heroines. -Judaism

After WW2, Japan was reborn on the principle of separation of religion and state, democracy and pacifism. For the past 79 years Japan has not been involved in any wars.

I once saw Israeli ambassador to UN hoisted The Old Testament claiming the whole Palestine for Israel. It is such a stupidity of the believers of Judaism. Anything written is written by someone, hence nothing more than the writer. Everything written is fabrication by the author. Religion simply insists on validity of the contents, while science is more humble. Only proven matters by theory and experiments are accepted as natural laws.
